- ▶ Development and conduct of a comprehensive training cycle, including regional guidelines and courseware for trainers, on Audit of Public Procurement (2014-2016)
- ▶ Acceleration of International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs) through a sustainable long-term training programme on ISSAI implementation in risk-based Financial Audit (since 2015)
- ▶ Research project and development of guidelines on Audit of Revenue (2015 – 2016)
- ▶ Establishment of a SAI-to-SAI mentorship cooperation through the Lao-Thai-German Trilateral Cooperation “Support to Financial Audit for the State Audit Organization of Lao PDR”
- ▶ Establishment of ASEANSAI as a platform for regional capacity development, using international IDI-training standards

ASEANSAI was established on 16 November 2011 in Bali, Indonesia. It encourages and promotes good governance within the ASEAN region. ASEANSAI focuses on regional knowledge exchange, capacity development for SAIs of the ASEAN member states, and technical cooperation in important and common audit issues.

ASEANSAI's Organizational Structure

In ASEANSAI, the Assembly is the highest decision-making body. The Executive Committee, comprising Chairman and Vice-Chairman of ASEANSAI, recommends, implements, and monitors policies set by the Assembly. Four Committees and a Secretariat are established to implement the Assembly's decisions, in line with the strategic goals and objectives of ASEANSAI.
