CONTEXT

The ten-year armed conflict in Nepal ended with the signing of the ‘Comprehensive Peace Agreement’ in 2006. In 2015, the country adopted a new constitution, which paved the way for democratic elections and federalism. However, Nepali society still holds significant risks for conflict. The transitional justice process is incomplete, thousands of people are still awaiting justice, discriminatory practices persist and add to marginalization of vulnerable groups and inequalities.

OUR WORKING AREAS AND PARTNERS



In the Civil Peace Service (CPS), we support groups of victims and conflict survivors in developing their ideas for memory work, raise concerns with local government bodies, and advocate for the implementation of transitional justice processes. We strengthen conflict transformation through capacity development, promotion of creative forms of social transformation and dialogue, psycho-social support services, and establishing systems to document and report human rights violations. We enable media actors to follow a conflict-sensitive approach, counter mis- and disinformation and to report on non-violent conflict transformation.
