Background

The implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and in particular the practice to achieve Goal 17 - Partnerships for the Goal are signified as strategic priorities for the Government of Indonesia. Since July 2017, a presidential decree has formalized the tasks of the different coordination centers at central, regional and local level and defines important milestones. There are various efforts and substantial progress in implementing SDGs both at national and provincial levels. At the provincial level, there have been many activities from various stakeholders, especially non-state actors, to support the achievement of SDGs at the community scale.

There are various challenges related to coordination between the parties at the national and regional levels in the implementation of SDGs and SSTC, which require collaboration in solving them. Numerous individual efforts to implement SDGs by state and non-state-actors have not yet been fully integrated, so the results





have not been optimal. This requires strengthening the multistakeholder partnership, as the spirit and core value of Goal 17, at all levels to integrate the implementation of achieving SDGs and to encourage the acceleration of achieving the targets.

Signifying the above mentioned, the project supports the synergy and complimentary between the implementation of the SDGs in Indonesia and South-South/ Triangular Cooperation as the concrete modality to jointly work together with Indonesia as global development partner.

Objectives

The objective of this project is the capacities and collaboration of state and non-state actors for implementing Agenda 2030 in Indonesia and in Indonesian South-South and Triangular Cooperation have been strengthened.

The modul goal indicators include:

- A new procedure for monitoring and reporting on the implementation of 2030 guidelines and implementation at the national and sub-national level has been applied.
- The National Coordinating Team on Indonesian South-South Cooperation (NCT SSC) has coordinated the implementation of 3 new gender sensitive triangular cooperation measures/operations with German participation.
- Indonesia and Germany have jointly presented the results of their cooperation on the 2030 Agenda at least 2 international events between 2020 and 2023.

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Approaches

For the implementation, GIZ will provide areas of assistance such as:

- Advising the National SDGs Secretariat on claryfing the mandate and responsibilities of the provincial level and its multistakeholder partnerships, mobilizing additional resources for the 2030 Agenda and re-designing monitoring, evaluation, and reporting.
- Leveraging non-state actors' engagement at the sub-national levels in achieving SDGs through supporting the operationalisation of four identified University SDGs centres in 4 pilot provinces (West Sumatera, North Kalimantan, Gorontalo, and East Nusa Tenggara)
- Jointly promote the Indonesia's best practices in achieving SDGs at the international fora.

- Continue strengthening the practices of South-South Triangular Cooperation in Indonesia through three technical cooperation and jointly identify, plan, implement as well as facilitate the process with the beneficiary countries, in line with Indonesian-German priority areas of cooperation (energy, environment, TVET/economic development).
- The continued support to the establishment process of the newly launched Indonesian AID (Agency for International Development) as coordinating agency for Indonesia's international development cooperation by jointly develop one guidelines/standard operational procedure of SSTC Indonesia as agreed by the NCT SSC or the Task Force for Indonesian AID.
- Strengthen the capacity of NCT SSC as the advisory board for Indonesian AID by documentation of events on lessons learnt from triangular cooperation experienced by NCT within the project framework.

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
